General Rules for All Exhibitors

- 1. Classes are open to all members of the Garden Club of Niagara.
- 2. Entries will be received from **11:30am till 12:25 pm** at the Niagara Parks School of Horticulture, October 24, 2016. Please do not arrive before 11:30 am as we will be setting up and the room will be closed till 11:30am. Judging will begin promptly at 12:30pm.
- 3. In the Design section, plant material must predominate over other components of the exhibit. Plant material may be from any source. The use of artificial material is forbidden. Space allowed is 24 inches wide by 30 inches deep and unlimited height for classes 1 and 5. Space allowed is 30 inches wide and 30 inches deep and unlimited height for classes 2 and 4. Designs will be staged on tables. Class 3 will be displayed in acrylic frames at eye level.
- 4. Entrants may enter any number of classes in the **Design** section but may only submit one entry per class.
- 5. Entrants may enter any number of classes in the **Horticulture** section and may place two entries of different cultivars/varieties in each class.

 All exhibits in the Horticultural section must have been grown by the exhibitor for three months prior to the show and should be named if possible for education purposes.
- **6.** Exhibitors must provide their own containers for all exhibits.
- 7. The standard for judging: Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Horticulture and Design (2003)

Awards First, Second and Third Place ribbons will be awarded; Honorable mention at Judge's discretion. **Design:** Best in Show - Phylis Patrick Award **Horticulture -** Best in Show - Millie LeGrow Award

Design:

Class 1 "Tranquillity" – a design - Limited to 5 entries

(Design judges may not enter this class)

- Class 2 "The Unexpected" a design Limited to 4 entries
- Class 3 "Hidden Gem" a miniature design (fresh) Limited to 5 entries
- Class 4 "Rugged" a design Limited to 4 entries
- Class 5 "Hot, Hot, Hot!" a design Limited to 5 entries

Horticulture:

- Class 6 Coleus 1 stem
- Class 7 Dahlia one bloom
- Class 8 Any other Annual 3 stems
- Class 9 Any other perennial- one stem, spike or spray
- Class 10 Collection of fall foliage 3 5 different cultivars
- Class 11 Collection of garden flowers to include five to seven different cultivars shown in one container
- Class 12 Ornamental grass seed heads, 3 stems not to exceed 36"


